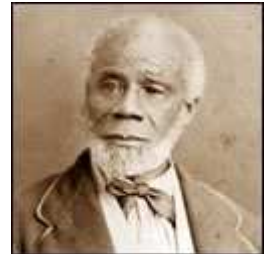

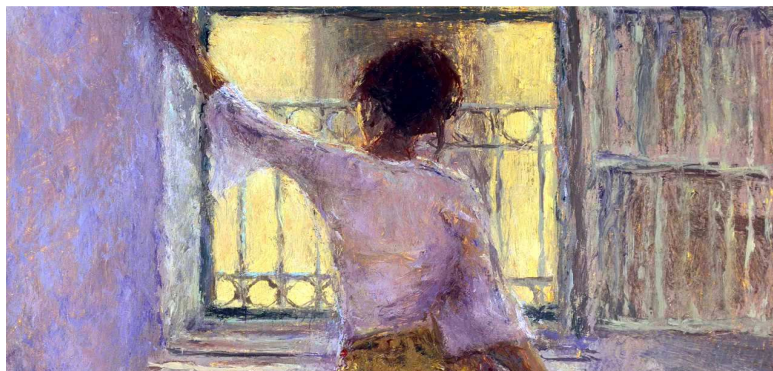
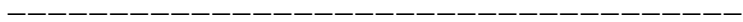


Author and retired Educator, Edward Milo Johnson

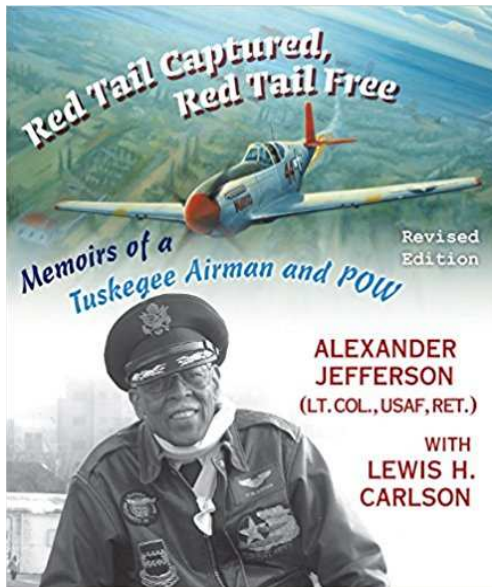
A Visual Art Documentary

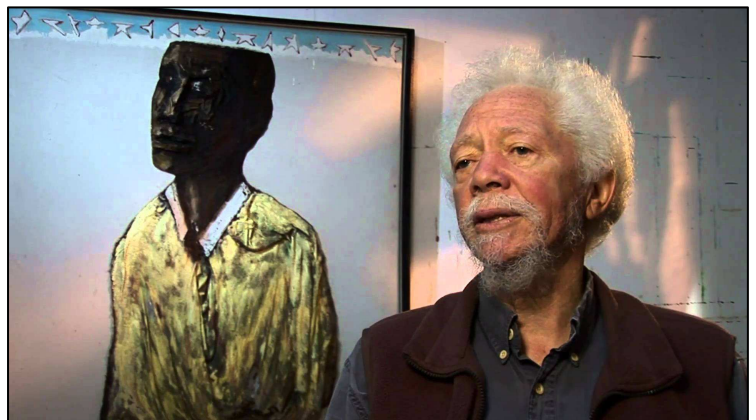
